Minor Children (skip if you do not have minor children)

In the unfortunate event that you are unable to raise your minor children (under age 18), who do you want to have physical custody of the children ("Guardian")? When selecting a Guardian, it is important to choose someone who shares your values, goals and parenting styles.

If you are unable to raise your minor children, you will also need to appoint someone to handle the finances for the children ("Conservator"). When selecting a Conservator, it is important to choose someone who shares your financial goals and has proven to be financially responsible.

It is recommended, but not required, to name different individuals to act as Guardians and Conservators. It is counterproductive to name one individual to perform both job functions if they are not the best person for the job. Separating these responsibilities into two different individuals provides a system of checks and balances for the children.
